2011(Elite) Men's World Championships

Event: 2011(Elite) Men's World Championships

Date: September 16 – October 01, 2011

Location: Baku, Azerbaijan

Selection Date: February 28, 2011

Nomination procedures:

Introduction:

To be eligible for the 2011 (Elite) Men's World Championships, the athlete must have a valid **Canadian Passport** on the date of the beginning of the new Team Selection year, and the athlete shall have been a legal resident in Canada for a minimum period of one year before being considered.

Athletes must meet the International Amateur Boxing Association (AIBA) requirements to be eligible to represent Canada at major international events including World Championships and the Olympic Games.

Athletes with dual citizenships who represented another country at the following competitions: Olympic Games, World Championships, Pan-American Games, Francophone Games or the Commonwealth Games within the two previous years are not eligible.

Athletes must be a member in good standing of Boxing Canada and must compete in the same weight class.

Only athletes that have podium potential will be selected to represent Canada at the 2011 Elite Men's World Championships.

Selection Criteria:

1. National Team "A" Members who, on the selection date, have won a minimum of 40% of their International bouts (minimum 4 bouts) in AIBA or CABA sanctioned competitions, between March 1st 2009 and February 28, 2011 will be selected for the 2011 (Elite) Men's World Championships;
2. National Team "A & B" Members can be selected by the High performance Director (HPD) if the athlete can contribute to Boxing Canada performance at the 2011 (Elite) Men's World Championships. In making this nomination the HPD will take into consideration the following:

- a. Performance Evaluations from International Competition over the last two seasons with greater emphasis placed on the current season and:
 - i. Matches against probable opponent at the Worlds;
 - ii. Matches against boxers ranked in the top 12 in the World;
 - iii. Ability to perform under pressure;
 - iv. Ability to defend a lead;
- b. Following the National Team Program
- c. Participation in National Team Training Camp during current season
- d. Discipline on and off the trip
- e. Team Leadership and Spirit
- f. Performance at the previous Worlds Championships

Final Approval:

The HPD is responsible for the nomination of athletes to the 2011 (Elite) Men's World Championships.

Mandatory Training Camps:

Mandatory training camps for selected Elite boxer will be scheduled in August for evaluation and preparation for the Worlds. Participation is required to confirm their selection.

The date, duration and location of the camp are still to be confirmed. No training camps will be added with less than three weeks notice.

Any boxer who does not attend these camps will have their selection revoked by the HPD.

Amendments and Unforeseen Circumstances:

In the event of unforeseen or unusual circumstances, as determined by the High Performance Director, the HPD shall have full discretion to resolve the matter as it sees fit taking into account factors and circumstances that it deems relevant. Any such exercise of discretion shall be subject to the Canadian administrative law and principles of fairness.

Appeals:

Boxing Canada Appeals Policy governs all decisions made by Boxing Canada, including issues pertaining to selection. All appeals should be address to the Executive Director of Boxing Canada at robert.crete@boxing.ca

Changes to this document:

The HPD reserves the right to makes changes to this document, which in his discretion are necessary to ensure selection of the best athlete possible for the 2011 (Elite) Men's World Championships. Any changes to this document shall be communicated directly to all National Team Members (National Team "A" and "B" Members) and published on Boxing Canada website.

This selection criteria was approved by the Technical Committee on October 25, 2010.
